

# EVENTS - STANFORD COMMITTEE FOR PEACE IN VIETNAM


There will be no public witness locally this weekend. Rather, we urge you join the San Francisco rally to be held concurrently with the Conference of Unrepresented People (see appended leaflet): 1pm, Union Square, Saturday, August 7.

On Friday, August 6, we mark the 20th anniversary of Hiroshima with a noon rally at White Plaza on campus. Roy Kepler will be one of the speakers.

Sunday, as usual, there will be precinct work in conjunction with Concerned Citizens of Palo Alto, between 1&5pm, from Tresidder Union front porch. Kits and instructions are prepared. Also this Sunday (August 8) we mean to confront the churches with reminders of Hiroshima and of their silence in the Viet Nam War. On Saturday, August 14, we are attending a major rally held by the Concerned Citizens of Palo Alto at Cogswell Park (on Lytton, across from the Palo Alto Times) at which the speakers will be: Harry Bremond, local attorney concerned with civil rights cases (he has also done our legal work), Frances Herring, recently returned from a Jakarta meeting with N. Vietnamese and Viet Cong women, Gregory Sims, Episcopal minister, and Karel de Leeuw of Stanford. The rally will be followed by a march and protest demonstration for those so moved, and it should be considered one in our continuing series of demonstrations on the local level to acquaint the public with responsible opposition to the War.

We feel that, even with an apparent (?) moderation of Administration policy, opposition (as well as the War) must continue apace. Weak as we are, we cannot afford to let the President call the plays, but rather we must make two inches out of every inch he gives us. Otherwise, we may find that we have been put off our guard and then had. Let us continue.
