

REFUSAL OF INDUCTION

You are not in the military until you take the "magic step" forward. If all else fails, you can refuse to take the step, giving written explanation for legal purposes. For legal reasons you should complete the process up to then, unless, of course, you are resigned to going to jail or underground. Refusers are liable to sentences up to 5 years and \$10,000, although usually fines are not assigned and sentences average about 3 years. Anti-Draft groups will help refusers obtain legal aid. GOING INTO THE MILITARY

Once you are in you do not have control of where you go. You might not serve in Vietnam, but wherever you are you will be part of the war machine. And you might fight in Detroit, Thailand, or Latin America. In the military you have few rights. Refusers in the military have been given prison sentences as long as twenty years--at hard labor. The army rarely recognizes guys who become C.O.'s after entering.

You can probably force a "dishonorable" discharge, but these are usually accompanied by time in the brig. The army needs cannon fodder and it is not anxious to let it go.

It is hard to get out. The Man has the power and he wants you. Most of us will go only to certain limits to be deferred or exempted, and we must carefully examine the future implications of what we do now. Nevertheless, there are many ways to get out which you should try, even though they may seem unlikely. This pamphlet only presents a broad view of your alternatives. For further information or to discuss problems, you should contact the addresses inside.

You might be deferred now, but not safe. See us now before it's too late. The draft situation is constantly changing. And most of the ways of getting out are complicated, requiring accurate counselling.

The Stanford Anti-Draft Union is a union of guys who will not take part in the war. Most of us will not allow ourselves to be conscripted. The Anti-Draft Union is willing to help any guy who does not want to go.
