Antidrafters found guilty in Altos case

Four persons were found guilty early today of trespassing at Los Altos High School on June 5 as they and antidraft leader David Harris held a convocation.

The verdict was returned at 1 a.m. today by a jury in Palo Alto - Mountain View Municipal Court. The jury began deliberations at 4 p.m. Monday.

The defendants were tried on the twin charges of trespass and of disruption of the school. They were Jan S. Sutter, 21, 1093 Los Altos Ave., Los Altos; Patrick J. Conroy, 21, of Fresno; Miss Linda P. Crouse, 31, 1868 Mark Twain St., Palo Alto; and Frederick L. Moore, 30, no address.

Miss Crouse and Sutter were acquitted by the jury of the

school disruption charges, but Moore and Conroy were found guilty. All of the charges are misdemeanors, each carrying maximum sentences of six months in jail, and fines of \$500.

The trial began Sept. 15 and concluded with final arguments Monday afternoon.

Moore represented himself during the trial, while attorney Leslie C. Nichols of Los Gatos represented the other three defendants. The prosecutor was Craig M. Brown, deputy district attorney.

The convocation at the school building took place during the students' lunch break, and was designed to inform graduating boys about their right to refuse induction. Eight persons were arrested after Principal Dushan Angius summoned police. He argued that the convocation was illegal and that it disrupted final examinations even though the students were at lunch.

Harris, former Stanford University student president and husband of folksinger Joan Baez, also was arrested. He is now in an Arizona federal prison, serving a sentence for refusal to register for the draft.

Prosecutor Brown said today that Harris, along with the other three persons arrested, eventually would be brought to trial, although no date has been assigned the case.

Judge William Ingram set Oct. 1 as the date for probation reports and sentencing of the four defendants. Nichols
