

## The Press and US

The self-censuring media in advanced industrial societies, in addition to exacting their profit, serve an invaluable role in controlling the thoughts and, therefore, actions of the people. So we are not surprised that the people of the world learn about our polished shoes but nothing of our demands. Televisions all over the country will show us in the halls of AEL being awakened by their flood lights, but they do not mention that we are in the building to prevent CBW, counterinsurgency and other war-related research that is developed on our campus and deployed each day to kill people in Southeast Asia and South America.

The press stresses our gentility, for Stanford, up until lately, has been exclusively a school for the rich, and implicitly contrasts this with the bogus issue of violence on the campus. The people of this country must learn that this is a euphemism for an attack by four hundred helmeted state troopers, who more often than not remove their badges so that they may remain as unidentified and therefore as blameless as the trustees and researchers against whom we now protest. The administration must not be lulled by our display of reason. Every action that we have taken has been the result of a rational choice. But the bombing of Nagasaki was also a rational decision, and so we may choose otherwise.

The press stresses the preparations for disciplinary procedures, but we are no longer the naughty children bored by our grade school class who had to be silenced so that education might progress in its normal and self-blinded fashion. What we have done we have done seriously, and to compare the punishment meted out in the moot

## WE DEMAND TRUSTEES MEET

Students supporting the occupation of AEL voted overwhelmingly this afternoon to demand that the Trustees have an open decision-making meeting Monday and that decisions regarding the holding of AEL be made pending the results of this Trustee meeting.

They also tabled the motion that the Academic Council meet on Tuesday because a guidelines committee had not yet set up a review board or carefully defined guidelines for research.

Students further voted support of the "struggle" in which students at Harvard and Radcliff are engaged.

It was announced that The Stanford Daily sent telegrams to 20 universities calling for students to resume research now in progress at their campuses. The telegram also called for expressions of support.

The following activities for the weekend at AEL are now being planned: a renaming ceremony Friday at noon for the AEL building; a seminar Saturday afternoon, and a lecture Sunday afternoon.

## INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION MOVE


We, the International Association, Foreign and American Students, feel the need very strongly to state our firm support to you students directly engaged in struggle with Stanford on SRI war activities.
