I, Robert Rosch, say and declare:

1. I am employed by the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LELAND STANFORD JUNIOR UNIVERSITY as Assistant Dean of Students. In this capacity, I am responsible for working with students in the residence program, as a counsellor and in their behavioral problems. I have been continuously employed since September 4, 1968 in this capacity.

2. On May 1, 1969 at approximately 2:30 a.m., I entered Encina Hall on the Stanford campus. Over an amplifier I heard Joel Smith announce to the people present that they were in violation of President Pitzer's emergency regulation concerning students participating in a sit-in, and that they would be given immediate, temporary suspensions if they did not leave the building within 15 minutes. Joel Smith proceeded through the building and made the same announcement at various places on all three floors of the building and the basement at approximately three places on each floor. The total time occupied in these announcements was approximately 20 minutes.'

3. At approximately 3:05 a.m. on May 1, 1969 I again entered Encina Hall, this time accompanied by several faculty members. In the building, I observed Alan C. Alhadeff, Ronald Barliant, Jeanne T. Friedman, Stephen J. Heiser, Marc D. Heller, Neal Okabayashi, Paul Rupert, Amanda G. Rutherford, James E. Shoch, Doron Weinberg, and Michael Weinstein.

4. Inside the building, I observed people ransacking desks, forcing doors and breaking windows.

5. At approximately 7:00 a.m., the Santa Clara County Deputies and some faculty members entered Encina Hall; I observed that all of the people in the building left within about 15 minutes. At this time I observed Richard A. Levin and Susan L. Hudgens leaving the building.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true.
