

A F F I D A V I T

I, William L. Leland, say and declare:

1. I am employed by the BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LELAND STANFORD JUNIOR UNIVERSITY as Senior Counselor for Special Services. In this capacity, I am responsible for counseling students in matters pertaining to the Selective Service System. I have been continuously employed since June 1, 1968 in this capacity.

2. On May 1, 1969 at approximately 2:30 a.m., I entered Encina Hall on the Stanford campus. I accompanied Joel Smith and observed him make announcements to the occupants of the building.

3. At approximately 3:05 a.m. on May 1, 1969 I again entered Encina Hall, this time accompanied by Willard Wyman. In the building, I observed William C. Black, Richard S. Bogart, Fred H. Cohen, Robert A. Delfs, Arthur M. Eisenson, Jeanne T. Friedman, William W. Graham, Mary A. Hanson, Stephen J. Heiser, Marc D. Heller, Michael M. Menke, Neal Okabayashi, Paul Rupert, James E. Shoch, John F. Shoch, Stephen S. Smith, Guy D. Smythe, Don P. Stuart, Michael D. Vawter, Doron Weinberg, Michael M. Weinstein, and Stephen Weissman.

4. At approximately 7:00 a.m., the Santa Clara County Deputies and some faculty members entered Encina Hall; I observed that all of the people in the building left within about 15 minutes.

5. After the building was emptied I observed about 75 people connected with the occupation of Encina Hall, including several whom I had earlier seen in the building, and specifically including Richard S. Bogart, Fred H. Cohen, Mary A. Hanson, Stephen J. Heiser, Marc D. Heller, Paul Rupert, James E. Shoch, John F. Shoch, Guy D. Smythe, Michael D. Vawter, and Stephen Weissman, outside Encina Hall. I heard some of these people say they intended to re-enter and re-occupy Encina Hall, or to occupy the President's Office on the Stanford campus, or to occupy other buildings on the campus and disrupt the activities therein.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true.
