Re: Cessation of Objectionable Research on campus and at S.R.I.

The members of this community, never ceasing in their desire to focus attention on the primary issues relating to research both on campus and at S.R.I., wish to note our appreciation of the convening of this special session.

In order to liberate you from the consideration of any extraneous matters, and to urge you to the immediate resolution of the substantive issues we have raised -- we have temporarily vacated the Applied Electronics Laboratory.

We have noted this past week the deep concern of many members of the faculty. We trust that this unencumbered meeting of the Academic Council will produce immediate and tangible implementation of that concern.

I- At both Stanford and S.R.I.:

- a - no chemical, biological warfare research;
- b - no counter-insurgency research;
- c - no research directed against the peoples of Vietnam, Laos, Thailand;
- d - no work classified by sponsorship, publication of results, or need-to-know, with the exception of incidental information.

II- S.R.I. to be brought under closer control of the University community.

III- The formation of a review and guidelines board, consisting of faculty, students, S.R.I. employees, and other people affected by the research.
