800 MEMBERS OF THE APRIL 3RD MOVEMENT (A3M) VOTED TODAY TO DISRUPT THE ACTIVITIES OF THE HANOVER STREET FACILITIES OF STANFORD RESEARCH INSTITUTE (SRI), STARTING FRIDAY MORNING. THE HANOVER FACILITIES OF SRI ARE ENGAGED ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY IN COUNTER-INSURGENCY RESEARCH.

For over six weeks, the A3M has demanded that counter-insurgency research be terminated both at SRI and on the Stanford campus. They will try on Friday to prevent that research from being done.

The April 3rd Movement has invited all residents of the Bay Area to join with them in their actions.

The vote of the movement came the day after the Stanford board of Trustees' decision to sell SRI. The A3M felt the trustees' curtailment of chemical and biological warfare research was not an acceptable attempt to eliminate war-related research at SRI. The trustees did not try to limit classified, counter-insurgency, or other military research currently being done.
