

to help Thailand improve government operations and that Chancellor Pitzer's vice-president Rudolph Brunsvold commented that "this is an extension of our work---not a new contract." In keeping with this "extension", "seven additional such controversial projects are pending presently; five contracts for Southeast-Asia, including counter-insurgency totaling \$760,000 and two chemical and biological warfare projects totaling \$98,000."

In response to these developments, and in commemoration of the first anniversary of the NLF Tet offensive, we call for a series of actions this week that will begin to translate our protracted rhetoric into the protracted struggle necessary to achieve our demands.

We propose:

- 1, that a group of people---those of use here now plus those we can contact overnight---go to Pitzer's office, Tuesday at 12:30, to present the list of demands concerning the University's participation in the violence perpetrated against the people of the world, and to further demand that he appear at the Old Union on Wednesday, January 29, at 12:30, to explain his failure to meet these demands and to answer to the "extension" of university involvement with counter-insurgency research.
- 2, that SDS call for a community forum and confrontation with Pitzer at the Old Union on Wednesday, the purpose of which will be to begin to consolidate our support, and to focus that strength against the continuation of "business as usual" by the administration.
- 3, that sometime later in the week, Thursday or Friday, similar demonstrations take place at any or all of the following:
  - a, Applied Electronics Lab---to demand a cessation of the military-electronics research going on there and/or to demand that research be done for the NLF to support their just struggle.
  - b, Pitzer's office---to bring it home to the man with all the connections.
  - c, SRI---no explanation needed.
- 4, Some further suggestions are: that the struggle be taken into "business as usual" classrooms, that SDS launch guerrilla theatre activity, and that students display graffiti, flags, general disgust, revolutionary zeal, or just plain outrage, here, there and everywhere.
