

## SRI AND ELECTRONIC WARFARE

In case anyone was wondering which institution the Defense Department might award AEL's Electronic Warfare contracts to, should we ban such "secret" research on campus, they might take note of the following list of contracts.

According to the latest available Defense Department releases, these contracts are STILL GOING ON AT SRI:

- Distortion Effects of Parameter Amplifiers  
with Application to Missile Site Radar
- Electronic-Counter-Measure Penetration Aids
- Electronic-Counter-Measure Susceptability of  
Terrain-Clearance Avoidance and Following Equipment
- A Study of the Effectiveness of Ground Based  
Electronic-Counter-Measures against a Terrain  
Following Flight Control System
- Optical Battlefield IFF System
- Application of Intelligent Automata to Reconnaissance
- Acoustic Countermeasures: Concepts and Techniques  
for the protection of Carrier Task Forces
- Target Acquisition Sensor Technology in the 1975-  
1985 Time Period

Remember, also, that should SRI be severed, the "rights" of the faculty at AEL to consult for them could not be infringed upon. Given that AEL personnel are now consulting for the Army Electronics Command, the Navy's "First Fleet Electronic Warfare Officer," the Department of Defense, and firms in the Industrial Park making radar jamming devices, it would seem logical that they would move to consult for a severed SRI on matters of electronic warfare.
