# S.R.I.P

We must not lose focus on the basic issue of S.R.I. Direct personal contact and communication between concerned factions of the Stanford Research Institute and the Stanford campus has been virtually lacking. This has been partly an organizational problem, but has to be resolved immediately in view of the headlong rush of events including the recent administrative action in the form of an injunction issued in the name of the Stanford Trustees against the members of the April Third Movement in an attempt to undermine the growing strength and community that has consolidated in denouncing the Trustee inaction over crucial issues concerning immoral, wasteful war-related research.

An alliance between the campus community and S.R.I. community established through communication and feedback is of utmost necessity in view of the impending Trustee decisions this month and the consequences that may ensue. There are a multitude of issues that must be seriously discussed and worked out through informal meetings with S.R.I. employees. For instance, few people have mentioned the altering of the S.R.I.-Stanford Charter as a very possible outcome of the May 13 meeting which would simply entail reorganizing the power structure so that the Trustees relinquish formal control of the decision-making process to the administrators of S.R.I. Campus control of the outcome of crucial S.R.I. decisions would be considerably weakened and influence over the destiny of S.R.I. would fall more than ever on the employees of the institute. As the ultimate outcome of S.R.I. may rely heavily upon the attitudes of these employees, it is imperative that first we establish a sense of community, of a larger united Stanford community. Secondly, we must work out the basic structure of how such a community can and will exist.
