ACLU urges Stanford University to move to quash the subpoenses issued by the Senate Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations for records of campus organizations and leaders at your institution. The attempt to force universities into revealing such information is an intrusion by government into the affairs and independence of any educational institution.

A similar experiences with the old House UnAmerican Activities Committee was regarded by students, faculty, and most university administrators as an attack on academic freedom a threat to be freedom of expression association and assembly of the academic community. Rather than shedding light on the natyure of campus disturbances, the Senate subcommittee's action will only serve to excalate tension and widen thebreach between students and administrators.

In view of the serious constitutional defects of these subpectage, we are prepared to offer full civil liberties and legal assistance challenging this assault on the First Amendment.
