







The faculty decided on Memorial Day to issue a statement to the effect that it would not provide the MCCellan Committee with information which would endanger either themselves or others regarding Constitutional Rights. A more revolutionary approach to MCCellanism would be for concerned Stanfordites to join forces with Reis Tijerina, who plans a citizen's arrest of U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice nominee Werren E. Burger, and arrest the whole damn bunch. A super-bust after the fashion of San Francisco State College, but with roles reversed. This time the people would do the arresting. The timing would be perfect as the arrest which Mr. Tijerina claims he will make is scheduled for the same time and place as Pitzer is to appear. The appointed time and place is June 3 at the Senate Building. Likewise, the grounds for arrest are the same: Constitutional. Brother Tijerina has called on others to assist if the occasion demands - - -.

Aside from purely Constitutional grounds, Pitch need not honor the whims of a dishonorable politican. Senator MCCellan did not serve the people well by shirking his duty to investigate the murder of President Kennedy at the hands of Lee Oswald. The reason for this hands-off position adopted by MCCellan is that the Billie Sol Estes affair and the TFX warplane, two central weaknesses of Capitalism also under MCClellan's jurisdiction, played a role in motivating Oswald. The senator finked on all three, passing the Kennedy assassination to Earl Warren, and covering up Estes and the TFX. (The senator is now for the ABM.)

Studying the history of Oswald, one finds that his military obligation as he saw it matured at the time the Cuban missile crisis began on October 24, 1962. The mistake researchers make is to consider instead the time Oswald was given the bad conduct discharge after he defected to the Soviet Union in 1959. It is vital to realize that this coinciding of dates had an effect on Oswald far beyond the effect the near fatal missile crisis had on all persons aware it was occuring. If it is granted he was uptight rather than only scared like the rest of us, the next thing to look for is his purchase of weapons, which soon occured. There is a pattern to these purchases. The pistol was ordered soon after the missile crisis, or at least reasonably soon enough to be considered a result of this event which put Kennedy in the spotlight and embarrassed Fidel Castro. Castro was Oswald's hero.

Two other events, the State trial of Billie Sol Estes and the rumor of General Dynamics being awarded the TFX contract, occured when the Cuban missile crisis began. Super-Marxist Oswald did not approve of the way the trial of super-Capitailist Billie Sol Estes was being handled. And one of the people most responsible in Oswald's mind for the corrupt TFX contract, a lawyer turned Secretary Of The Navy, had the same last name (Korth) as the lawyer who helped split the family by acting as counsel for the assassin's mother when she sued for divorce.

The next time these events were in the news together, a review for all except the Billie Sol Estes litigation, Oswald ordered another weapon. The date was March 10, 1963. Estes' Federal trial began at that time. It is the Estes litigation that must be used as a guide to research.

What is the point of all this? The point is that M Cellan should have looked to Oswald for a motive for his actions, and Oswald should have been tried in a Court rather than murdered. Likewise, M Cellan should look to students for their motivation rather than consulting the oppressor of these students. The Warren Commission was full of distinguished men like Pitzer who contributed nothing but confusion.
