

Deans Say Campus Unrest is Decreasing

Los Angeles

Campus unrest has reached its high mark and will gradually diminish, a spokesman for deans of major U.S. graduate

schools predicted yesterday.

Gustave O. Arlt, president of the Council of Graduate Schools, said in an interview:

"There will still be sporadic

unrest in some places here and there for some years.

But on the whole there will not be such serious disruption as we have had in the past."

He said that when violence first broke out on American campuses, administrators were not prepared to handle the situation.

"Now they have learned

... and are much more equipped to deal with disruption when it first starts or to forestall violence before it breaks out."

He suggested the Govern-

ment pass laws to enable university administrators to get Federal injunctions so that U.S. marshals instead of local police handle disturbances.
