

GET A JOB !

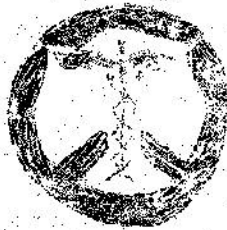

LABOR SYMPOSIA: A series of symposia with labor are being planned. These will present specific information on the war and alternatives to the war economy to the 100 to 200 group attending. The first symposium on June 27 is aimed at local labor officers and workers. Other will involve engineers and white collar workers. Three full time jobs are available: speakers, physical arrangements, and publicity coordinators. At least one person will be paid. The goals of the symposia are to promote a political awareness in the labor community and to facilitate a dialogue between the intellectual community and labor. SPEAKERS COORDINATOR: (Full time for a week followed by occasional attention) Contacting all the speakers bureaus on campus to see where speakers are available which are appropriate to speak to labor. Coordinating these speakers. STOP for Peace. (See numbers above)

PUBLICITY CONNECTIONS: A firm working arrangement with the Maxwell Arnold Advertising Agency in San Francisco and free TV videotaping at San Francisco State are two of the opportunities just becoming available for people interested in publicity. The agency will give us free conseling and insights on how to sell political messages. A TV program on KQED is a distinct possibility. A chairmanship of the Publicity Committee will be open soon, as well as liason opportunities in press relations, professional publicity, and campus communications. MEDICAL POLICY NEEDS IN GOVERNMENT:

The Medical Communications committee is redirecting a portion of its efforts to preparing statements on various medical issues. These include national health insurance, community health centers, medical manpower education, government spending in health care and health education, poverty, the environment, and others. The information for these statements will be gathered from various progressive medical groups in the nation who are interested in these problems. The statements will then be presented to political candidates to become a part of their platform. The senators who are primarily responsible for health legislation have expressed the need for input of such information and pressure on political candidates to take stands on health issues.

The group will also seek to identify constituencies who will support candidates for their stands on health issues. Contact the NERVE CENTER for information to get involved in this work.

DEMOCRATIC MEANS: The Democratic Means committee has organized along two lines. The primary effort is to go out into the community to find people sympathetic with movements to end the war. These people will be molded into a group working for passage of the McGovern-Hatfield amendment and continuing activities through the November elections.

Other efforts will be directed through representatives from each department on the committee. These representatives will organize groups in their departments which will then reach out into the community to organize antiwar sentiment.
