## DR. GONDA'S STATEMENT ON EMPLOYEE PARTICIPATION

"In the days ahead, members of the Stanford Community will be informing themselves and others about some of the major issues involving the Nation. There are many forums available in the surrounding communities for education and expression of one's views.

"We hope that all interested Stanford University Hospital employees will find means of participation satisfactory to them. Those employees who feel they must participate during their usual working hours may request reasonable time off for this activity. Of course, it is understood that patient care must in no way suffer on account of such activity. Thus each department head and supervisor must evaluate his department's patient care obligations in acting on the requests."

## MINORITY SUPPORT

A group of minority employees, called "Minority Employees of the Stanford Medical Center", has issued the following statement:

"Be it resolved that because of the racist and imperialistic war in southeast Asia, and because of the exploitation of the poor and minorities in this country, we renounce the hypocrisy of the government with regard to the aforementioned issues and support all efforts to terminate this hypocrisy."

Stanford Medical Center faculty and staff have in the past week redirected many of their regular activities of the medical school to efforts to end the war in Vietnam. This is the first time minority employees have spoken out as a group on the issue.

Minority members make up approximately one-fourth of the medical center's three thousand total employees.
