1. We, the students, faculty and staff of the Department of Communications, voluntarily agree to suspend classes in protest for reasons listed below. This suspension will allow us to take positive action on specific projects which relate to our opposition to American involvement in Southeast Asia. This decision will be reconsidered after the Academic Senate meets on Thursday, May 7.
2. We condemn U.S. military involvement in Southeast Asia, and in particular, the bombing of North Viet Nam and the movement of American forces into Cambodia. We endorse the recommendation of the Academic Council on this point.
3. We demand justice for all Americans and it is our conviction that the legal system must not be used to limit legitimate political dissent.
4. We call for an end to university involvement in the training of military officers in the R.O.T.C. program.
5. We urge the termination of existing war-related research activities as soon as possible, and demand that there be no new war-related research activities at the university.
6. We clearly understand that financial difficulties may result to the university from the removal of R.O.T.C. and war-related research, and we indicate our willingness to share that burden.
7. We express our commitment to a non-violent strike, and we condemn any violence during the strike on the campus, and we urge the University Community and specifically the Academic Senate to dedicate themselves to seeking out and alleviating the causes of violence at Stanford.

The department is currently developing a list of projects which will be acted upon at a GAN meeting in Redwood Hall on Tuesday, May 5.
