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At 9:00 A.M. the Communications Department met to give reports of the various group strike activities and to discuss new business.

REPORTS

1) A Coordinating Committee meeting was held yesterday, when it was decided to call this morning's general meeting. We will begin each day this week with a general meeting at 9:00 A.M. A phone tree is being worked out.

2) T.V. Program Pat Crowley

The T.V. people are having trouble getting interest from the stations for their show because apparently the Stanford Strike is so low keyed that people outside don't know what is happening and are not interested. KQED (Dick Moore) would like something more than a straight show but as our time is too limited to make up something out of the ordinary he wants "big" people on it, including President Pitzer, Chancellor Heyns, a strike leader, an anti-strike leader, and journalists people. The earliest we can get air time is Friday night.

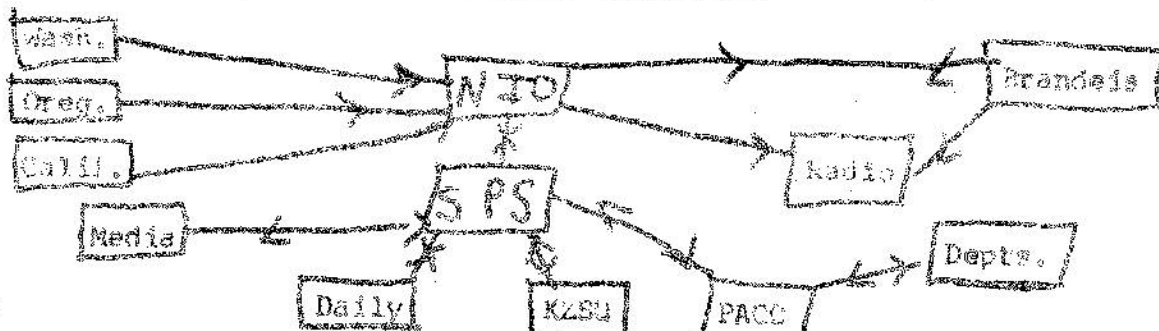
There is a possibility of sharing the regular Berkeley student news broadcast for a half hour. If KQED likes it they may put it on S.F. Mix. This will be a news program.

3) Radio--The Radio Project has reformed into a group to Organize the Informational System in the University and outside. Stanford has become the regional center for the ~~new~~ west coast (Calif. Oregon, Wash...) in a nationwide network of universities' communication involving Brandeis as the national headquarters with 12 regions.

- 5) Student Credibility Survey

- 6) Content-Analysis

The content-analysis people are still collecting data, covering the three major T.V. networks, local and national papers and a few international papers. They have not yet begun analyzation.

- 7) Opinion Poll

The results of the Maccoby opinion poll of ~~Tuesday~~ Monday night will be written up in press release form and given to Byers and to the Press service. We want to get it out onto the national wires.

- 8) Cross-Currents Issue

David Jones is in D.C. but they are going ahead. Their deadline for articles is Monday. They have 10-12 already but are willing to accept more if they are available.

- 9) Liberty Class

- 10) Bijay

A suggestion has been made to make a film piece about the Bijay incident to include in the T.V. program. This will involve getting other foreign students talking about how they feel about a member of their group being beaten and jailed.
