Do not go to work in the Order, Processing, Cataloguing, Automation, or RDP sections. Help the Government Documents, TIS, serials, stacks and Reference sections to stay OPEN to serve the community.

Help EXTEND our Library's services by joining one of our groups who are collecting and xeroxing vital materials on Southeast Asia, manning displays and making this information available both to the Stanford community and to the Palo Alto libraries.

Help type or write letters, and send telegrams to Senators, Congressmen, and President, as is being done in the Hansen Labs.

Go to the lectures on Southeast Asia given at 1:30, location announced in Daily
