

The Presence of ROTC on the Stanford campus is evidence of the University's continuing support of the Vietnam War. The efforts of President Pitzer and the government attest to their strong commitment to defend ROTC and defend the alliance of the military and the university.

Last night students were illegally assaulted by plainclothes policemen who did not identify themselves. Students were punched, maced, and dragged into police lines, and four were arrested on felony charges.

Legal Defense--These four have had bail set at \$1500 and above. Bail money is urgently needed. Large contributions will be refunded. Checks may be made to THE LEGAL DEFENSE FUND, care of the ASSU office in Tresidder. Donations for bond may be brought to any anti-ROTC meeting.

This Morning about 75 students attempted to peacefully attend 11:00 and 12:00 ROTC classes. ROTC instructors refused entrance to any who could not find seats, and threatened to invoke the campus policy on disruptions against those who shared seats or stood in back. Those who were allowed to remain witnessed an exciting patriotic film designed to inculcate fascist discipline and respect for the military code.

Possible Actions--Future action alternatives will be discussed in front of Cubberley auditorium. We need a broadly based movement, and ask all opposed to ROTC to participate on whatever level they can. Levels of action approved at last night's general meeting included:

- 1) dorm organizing and discussion sessions
- 2) mime troupe drama in White Plaza
- 3) a teach-in at the Academic Council Friday
- 4) critical participation in ROTC classes
- 5) continued action directed at the ROTC facilities
(a proposal for a sit-in was rejected for the present)

Affinity Groups will be forming tonight and in the next few days; even if you cannot participate tonight, we ask you to join one of these groups to help eliminate ROTC.
