

As we gather here tonight to demand the release of political prisoners, we cannot forget that the counter-revolution exists wherever people are fighting for their liberation. The U.S. military, colonial police forces, FBI, CIA, National Guard, and local police are attempting to suppress popular movements all over the World.

Today VIETNAM is the center of this world-wide struggle. The Reserve Officers Training Corps is one aspect of the counter-revolution felt by the Vietnamese people--and American GI's in Vietnam--daily. And each day, thousands of miles from Vietnam, one hundred yards from this auditorium on the Stanford campus, ROTC continues. ROTC is by no means Stanford University's largest contribution to the American war effort, but the renewal of ROTC at Stanford represents a last ditch effort by the Pentagon (and old friend David Packard) to roll back the mounting nationwide opposition to ROTC.

The Stanford New Moratorium Committee is building a movement to throw all vestiges of ROTC off campus. We need support--on and off campus.
