The Academic Council will consider an appeal of the Academic Senate's recent reversal of its position on ROTC. Last year the Senate, backed by a referendum of the entire faculty, voted to withdraw credit from ROTC at Stanford, a step which would have effectively eliminated the military from the Stanford campus. This year, under pressure from President Pitzer and the Department of Defense, the Senate agreed to a "compromise" which would allow the U.S. military to continue training officers at Stanford.

The Stanford faculty is known for its ability to give in under pressure. Despite supposed deep-felt moral convictions, it usually responds to the "way the wind blows." Come help them learn which way the wind blows at Stanford.
