'Possibility of more trustees

A larger board of trustees for a Stanford University, including a broader cross-section of society than the present board, is a definite possibility, President Kenneth S. Pitzer told the student legislature Thursday.

Pitzer said student, faculty and trustee members of the University Advisory Committee will give "careful and thorough discussion" to the merits of having a larger board.

He also said there is a "relatively strong consensus" that the next member of the board of trustees will be a faculty member from another college or university of comparable stature.

Pitzer said both students and faculty members of the advisory committee have submitted lists of potential trustees to replace David Packard, who resigned when he was named deputy secretary of defense.

It will be more than a month before the board chooses a successor to Packard.

Pitzer's comments on the trustees came in response to student questioning following his first talk with the legislature.

He also said he would convey to the trustees the views expressed earlier in the day by 700 students who asked that the university establish tighter controls over Stanford Research Institute (SRI).

Student body President Denis Hayes told Pitzer "the student body feels very, very grave concern" over the relationship with SRI, particularly SRI's involvement in chemical-biological warfare, counter-insurgency studies and Southeast Asia research.
