LABOR-STUDENT SYMPOSIUM

On June 27, 200 people from the labor and the university communities met at Stanford for a symposium sponsored jointly by the Santa Clara County Central Labor Council and the Stanford Medical Community for Peace. Union members and officials, professors, and students discussed the negative effects of U.S. foreign policy at home and abroad, as well as some of the components of our present domestic crises, specifically, failures in the economy, in health care delivery, and in the political system.

The outcome was encouraging. Participants decided to work together to create a labor-student coalition to better achieve the common goals of both groups. The most immediate goal is to end the war in Southeast Asia and to make it impossible for the U.S. to again become involved in an illegal and immoral war. Other goals are to design programs for converting from a military to a peacetime economy, and to develop better health care systems. To implement these proposals, a permanent committee of labor and university representatives has been formed and is meeting regulary.
