10 contendere to the charges.


11 After the hearing, the ^{Stanford} Student Judicial Council
12 recommended suspension as to each of those persons for the
13 following terms:

18 Theresa Ramirez, four-quarter suspension with
19 three quarters stayed;

25 In accordance with the applicable rules respecting the
