

PROTECTIVE REACTION!

AGAINST THE BOMBING AND INVASION OF NORTH VIETNAM

This week-end the U.S. bombed North Vietnam again. U.S. helicopters penetrated to within 20 miles of Hanoi. The War, as many have believed since spring, is not fading away.

Only massive reaction can prevent the re-occurrence of this week-end's escalation. If the American people do not tell Nixon "No!" then even nuclear weapons are a possibility in Southeast Asia.

Last night some people vented their outrage and anger by smashing a small part of one of the institutions aiding the prosecution of the war: Stanford University.

An even larger group voted to march on the Stanford Research Institute today at 12:00 p.m. SRI is closely connected with the war in general, through its various weapons and counterinsurgency programs, and with the bombing raids in particular. Bill Rambo and his AEL crew were forced out of Stanford because they were working on electronic warfare techniques useful against North Vietnamese ground defenses. They are now an integral part of SRI. The community should be reminded of the way this institution and these men are furthering the war effort. That research should not go unimpeded.
