100 YEARS OF STRUGGLE

1839-1860: The Opium Wars, the first revolts against imperialism and the forced sale of opium in China.

1900: The Boxer Rebellion, the first direct attempt to expell Western imperialism from China and regain territorial integrity.

1911: Sun Yat-sen Republican Rebellion, an unsuccessful attempt at bourgeois-democratic revolution. The landlords and the warlords remain in control of China.

1919: The May Fourth Movement, the awakening of intellectuals to China's social plight and their unification against imperialism.

1921: The founding of the Chinese Communist Party

1927: Agrarian Revolution, the first large scale organization of the peasantry into communes, guerrilla units and the People's Liberation Army.

OCTOBER 1, 1949: The final victory over imperialism and the beginning of the socialist revolution.

1965: The Cultural Revolution, recognition that the class struggle continues under socialism. Contradictions arise and must be resolved.
