The following letter has been handed to President Lyman:

We concerned foreign students, are outraged by the CJP's decision to immediately and indefinitely suspend Kwongping Ho, Alice Furumoto, and Don Lee, for their participation in a 20-minute disruption of Professor Shockley's class. We believe that the punishments are unjust and overly severe, and that the consequences of the decision endangers not only a specific member of our community, but also all of us, since the implication of the CJP decision severely threatens the extent of foreign student participation in campus activity:

We urge you to:

- 1) suspend the sentences; and
- 2) place a moratorium on all pending CJP cases until a judicial panel with a student majority is established in accordance with the overwhelming votes of the 1971 student referendums.

We shall return at 1:00 p.m. on Friday in order to discuss your response.
