PETITION TO THE ADVISORY BOARD IN THE CASE OF PROFESSOR FRANKLIN

We, the undersigned members of the faculty of Stanford University, believing that the Advisory Board hearings in the case of Professor H. Bruce Franklin will affect our rights and interests individually and collectively propose to intervene as concerned parties. This concern includes the relation of the charges brought against Professor Franklin to the performance of his academic duties, the possibility of contract violation by the President and other administrative officers of the University, the procedures employed in the case and the effect of the Injunction on the hearings, and the consequences this case may have for academic freedom and tenure protections. We fear that the unintimidated exercise of our rights and obligations as citizens and members of the teaching profession may be threatened if the prosecution succeeds in this case.

We believe it essential that the case be viewed in the larger context of a war that compromises or violates basic principles of our civilization, including the standards established by the Nuremberg Tribunal, and which has subverted the true purposes of institutions of learning in this country.

We agree with the position of colleagues who have argued recently that respect for the right of free expression is properly tested by the tolerance of unorthodox and unpopular ideas, and, therefore, we seek to intervene in defense of First Amendment rights and the traditional protections of academic tenure, and to ensure that the winds of freedom continue to ventilate this University. Accordingly, we assert our right to be heard by the Advisory Board, and we respectfully request that adequate provision be made, through our legal counsel, for our formal participation in the hearings.
