HOWARD BRUCE FRANKLIN

The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State, reviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on March 14, 1967, disclose that Howard Bruce Franklin was issued Passport Number G-681244 at San Francisco, California, on July 19, 1966, for proposed travel to France, England, and Denmark for the purpose to teach at Stanford in France and to work on a book. In his application, dated July 15, 1966, at Palo Alto, California, he stated his intention to depart from San Francisco International Airport via Pan Am (Charter) about September 23, 1966, for a stay of one year. This passport was valid for three years' travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba, and those portions of China, Korea, and Vietnam under communist control.

This individual stated that he was born on February 28, 1934, at Brooklyn, New York. He gave his permanent residence as 982 Lawrence Lane, Palo Alto, Santa Clara County, California. He listed his parents as Robert Franklin, father, born on April 16, 1903, at Jersey City, New Jersey, United States citizen, and Florence Maude Cohen, mother, born on November 15, 1905, at Brooklyn, New York, United States citizen. Franklin indicated that he was last married on February 11, 1956, to Jane Ferrebee Morgan, born April 13, 1934, at Rocky Mount, North Carolina. In event of death or accident, he requested that Mrs. Florence Franklin, mother, be notified at 45 Linden Boulevard, Brooklyn, New York.
