Observed parked in the driveway of Subject's residence were two vehicles, one a dark green Rambler station wagon bearing California license AXW 000, and the other a light blue Ford bearing California license BHH 771.

Records of the California State Department of Motor Vehicles, Sacramento, California, show that California license AXW 000 is registered to HOWARD BRUCE FRANKLIN, sole owner, 1060 Ringwood Avenue, Menlo Park, California, for a 1961 Rambler Station Wagon, Vehicle Identification Number B24149; and California license number BHH 771 is registered to HOWARD BRUCE FRANKLIN, sole owner, 1060 Ringwood Avenue, Menlo Park, California, for a 1959 Ford four-door sedan, Vehicle Identification Number B9LG124493.

made available a copy of a letter which was distributed in San Mateo County, California. This letter is addressed to the Port Authority Commissioner, Port of Redwood City, California, and is dated March 21, 1966. This letter protests the use of napalm by the United States in Vietnam and asks the Port Commissioners to not make their decision in haste in regard to authorizing a permit for the manufacture of napalm in Redwood City. This letter was signed by Professor and Mrs. H. BRUCE FRANKLIN, among others.

On May 21, 1966, Subject, accompanied by her husband and nine year old daughter, KAREN, appeared at the napalm manufacturing facilities of the United Technology Center, Redwood City, and placed leaflets on vehicles parked in the vicinity. The leaflets protested the manufacture and use of napalm. One of the signatures appearing on this leaflet was "Mrs. JANE M. FRANKLIN".
