THE VERDICT

Yesterday Richard Lie-man confirmed what he had demanded last February that Bruce Franklin should be fired for speaking out in opposition to the Indochina war and Stanford's role in it. Lie-man agreed with the Advisory Board that "tried" Franklin's case. It wouldn't be enough just to punish him because he was "beyond rehabilitation." So they had to get rid of him.

CLEANING HOUSE

David Packard, a former Stanford Trustee and ex-Deputy Secretary of the Defense Department, saw to it that Stanford got \$14 million a year from the Defense Department to do war research. He said to a meeting of heads of electronics firms in the area that the people in the anti-war movement were their "deadly enemies." And he told Lie-man, after the sit-ins at the Computer Center and the Hospital that it was time to "clean house" of all those troublemakers.

John Kellch, a library worker, was suspended from his job for heckling Henry Cabot Lodge. Then after a hundred people--students, workers, and community people--sat-in at the Stanford Hospital to protest the racist firing of Sam Bridges, five more workers were fired.

Now that Lie-man felt he had "cleaned house" among the workers, he concentrated all his efforts on the one tenured professor he thought had started the whole thing Bruce Franklin.

It cost him \$100,000 for a verdict that would tell him what he wanted to hear. And David Packard paid him a bonus of \$2.6 million out of his war profits.

SUPPORT BRUCE FRANKLIN

Bruce Franklin has been fighting for the rights of poor and working people for a long time. He spoke out for the right of workers to strike without loss of pay or vacation during the Cambodian invasion. He personally defended one of the workers fired in the Hospital sit-in. In fact, three years ago he aided workers who formed United Stanford Employees after they were kicked out of the Stanford Employees Association for supporting a sit-in against classified research at the Applied Electronics Labs.

It's time workers moved to support him, and to convince Lie-man that there will be more and more opposition—despite political firings—until Stanford is out of the war effort.
