

Over 100 people working at the Stanford Linear Accelerator Center are halting work on Monday, May 15, 1972, in protest against the war being fought by the United States in Indochina. We will be devoting our efforts throughout the day to a variety of anti-war activities.

We have undertaken these activities because we are shocked and alarmed by the President's attempt to blockade North Vietnam. Working as we do in a laboratory for basic scientific research, we are particularly outraged by the American government's abuses of advanced science and technology in waging this immoral war. We believe these policies are but reflections of the imperialism and racism which pervade the present American government.

We call upon you, our colleagues and fellow workers in other research institutions, to join us in an international effort to force a change in American policy in Vietnam.
