- (a) Hughes Research Labs: subsidiary of Hughes Aircraft Co.:
 -10th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$496,800,000 from DOD.
 -seeks employees for "design, devl of electronic & airborne missiles, ...radar & communication systems...
 ...informationsystems & hardware for surveillance..."
 (R & D for electronic battlefield)
- (b) McDonnell Douglas Astronautics Co.:
 -5th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$883,000,000 from DOD.
 -makes F-4 Phantom and F-15 fighters & various missile systems
- (c) Naval Civil Engineering Lab: U.S. Navy
- (d) Litton Industries - Data Systems Div.:
 -9th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$543,100,000 from DOD.
 -Information systems, airborne weapons systems, guidance, radar

- (e) U.S. Air Force: "Only we can prevent forests!"
- (f) General Motors Research Laboratories:
 - Division of General Motors Corp., which is 17th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$385,700,000 from DOD.
 - tanks, mortar shells, warheads, & equip for torpedos
 - Research Labs do military R & D
- (g) Honeywell, Inc.:
 - 16th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$397,900,000 from DOD.
 - Beehive and other cluster bombs, vehicles, electronic equip, weapons assemble, and missile systems.

 - 34th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$184,200,000 from DOD.
 - military electronics and aerospace
- (i) Asiatic Petroleum Corp.:
 - 46th largest military contractor in 1970, with \$126,300,000 from DOD.
